Andy Warhol began his commissioned portraits with a photo shoot using a Polaroid camera The Polaroid afforded a very high contrast image that Warhol enlarged and trans-ferred onto a silkscreen Each portrait was "under painted" first Warhol traced simple outlines of ...

- Warhol made paintings of iconic American objects such as dollar bills, Campbell's Soup Cans, Coca-Cola bottles, celebrities, and newspaper headlines
- Warhol was obsessed with fame and produced many pictures of the rich and famous
- He was never afraid to solicit commissions for portraits and would often suggest that he could

Andy Warhol is best known for his Pop Art Pop Art was a major movement of the 20th century in the United States that used elements of popular

culture, magazines, movies, music, bottles, cans (everyday objects seen in a NEW WAY) In the 1960's, he started to make paintings of famous American products
